

Parent/Guest Code of Conduct

- Please note that if any of the following guidelines are perceived as broken by a Met PGA official, the player may be subject to penalty and/or disqualification and the parent will be removed from the golf course. All individuals attending a Met PGA Junior Golf event do so at their own risk.
- Proper golf attire is required for all attendees. Individuals inappropriately dressed will not be permitted on the golf course. No Mock Necks, cargo shorts, jeans, tank tops, sweat suits, T-shirts, gym/mesh shorts, bicycle shorts, halter-tops, midriffs, or short shorts/skirts will be tolerated.
- Female's shorts/skirts MUST be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee.
- Parents/guests must stay on the cart paths or in the rough areas. Please remain clear of all fairways, tees, and greens. Remember to keep proper distance from all players (75 yards is recommended) and always remain alert.
- Parents/guests are allowed to aid in the search for lost golf balls. Parents/guests cannot walk with players during tournament play.
- Talking to competitors during tournament play is not allowed and can be construed as giving advice. This includes any conversation between player/spectator in their native language. In either instance, penalty for breach of this rule is two strokes. Players are responsible for the actions of their relatives and spectators in regards to this rule.
- Parents/guests can act as a forecaddie; carry umbrellas, jackets, medicine, food or drink, etc.
- Parents/guests are not to give rulings on the Rules of Golf. In stroke play, when a player is in doubt to a rules situation he/she may complete the hole by playing a "second ball" and report the facts to the Rules Committee before returning his/her scorecard.
- Allow Met PGA Rules Officials to administer rulings. You will be brought into a situation ONLY if the Rules Official asks you.
- Please keep all cell phones and electronic devices on silent.
- Parent/Guest carts are not permitted during tournament rounds. If you have a disability that prevents you from walking the golf course our staff will do its best to provide you with access to different viewing opportunities.
- Alcohol, swearing or abusive language will not be tolerated
- Parents/guests are attending this Met PGA event at their own risk. For your personal safety, we ask you exercise caution at all times. When inclement weather moves into the area, the Met PGA will suspend play by sounding air horns. Accordingly, you should seek shelter immediately. The Met PGA staff will evacuate players from the course first and then parents/guests.
